Blended (Hybrid) Structure

Half the classes in each course are offered online, resulting in dramatically reduced travel.

Easy Entry

There is no specific sequence of courses. Jump in and out as your schedule permits. Graduate on your schedule in $1^{1/2}$, 2 or 3 years.

No Fees

Districts generally reimburse course tuition but not fees. Many colleges charge fees for each course. Wilson has no course fees.

Competitive Tuition

Tuition is among the lowest in the region and payment can be deferred until 30 days from the end of each course. (\$25 extra to defer payment).

Classes in Multiple Locations

Cohorts have been established in multiple counties across Pennsylvania and Maryland, with more starting each semester. We can start a cohort in your district (minimum of eight students).

Course Accommodations

We can transfer up to two graduate courses and make accommodations in other ways. Special-subject teachers (art, P.E.) are welcome.



AN INDIVIDUAL EDUCATION

The Master of Education degree is designed for teaching professionals and is applicable to both elementary and secondary teachers.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Graduate course credit will be awarded only for earned grades of C or better. An electronic portfolio of course materials is also required at the completion of the M.Ed. program.
