AN INDIVIDUAL EDUCATION

The Master of Education degree is designed for teaching professionals and is applicable to both elementary and secondary teachers.

The program is based on the premise that successful teachers will need in-depth knowledge of pedagogy, a mastery of current theory and an understanding of research-based practices and technology to move from being good teachers to becoming great teachers.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

The successful M.Ed. candidate will complete 10 courses, including a Master's Action Research Project, while maintaining a cumulative grade-point average of 3.0 or higher. Graduate course credit will be awarded only for earned grades of "C" or better. An electronic portfolio of course materials is also required at the completion of the M.Ed. program.



PROGRAM ADMISSION

Students must submit all application credentials to be considered for the program. Students may enroll in an initial M.Ed.course before being accepted into the program, but to be formally admitted to the M.Ed. program, they must submit their completed application materials before finishing the course.
