### WILSON ADVANTAGES

#### Blended (Hybrid) Structure

Half the classes in each course are offered online resulting in dramatically reduced travel.

#### Easy Entry

There's no specific sequence of courses. Jump in and out as your schedule permits. Graduate on your schedule in 1 1/2, 2 or 3 years.

#### **No Fees**

Districts generally reimburse course tuition but not fees. Many colleges charge fees for each course. Wilson has no course fees.

#### **Competitive Tuition**

Tuition is among the lowest in the region and payment can be deferred until 45 days from the end of each course. (\$25 extra to defer payment).

#### **Classes in Many Locations**

Classes for cohorts are held in school district facilities.

#### **Course Accommodations**

We can transfer up to two graduate courses and make accommodations in other ways. Special subject teachers (Art, P.E., Special Ed.) are welcome.



## M. Ed. SATELLITE CAMPUS OPPORTUNITIES

Wilson can start a cohort in your school district with a minimum of eight students per cohort. Starting a cohort has many advantages:

- · Convenience
- · Savings in time and travel
- · Courses can be tailored to support district needs and goals
- The support of colleagues in cohort groups makes graduate work more interesting and pleasurable

The following process is recommended if teachers and/or administrators are interested in starting a cohort:

- Talk with colleagues about common interest in earning a master's degree together.
- Arrange a meeting or two with the Wilson M.Ed. Director to present the program to interested parties.
- $\cdot$  Decide the semester the cohort might like to begin.
- Seek qualified experts in the district who might like to teach specific courses (teachers with advanced degrees, supervisors, administrators).

## ADMISSION PROCEDURE

Retrieve application materials from www.wilson.edu/med or request application packet from M.Ed. office. Please submit the following materials:

- Application form, including electronic essays and resumé.
- \$35 non-refundable application fee (check payable to Wilson College).
- Official transcripts from all undergraduate and graduate colleges and universities attended must be sent directly to the director of the M.Ed. program.
- Two letters of recommendation from educators or employers. Please note, one letter should be from your current principal or supervisor. Letters should be mailed directly to the director of the M.Ed. program.
- Personal interview with the director of the M.Ed. program.

## **GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS**

The successful M.Ed. candidate will complete 10 courses, including a Master's Action Research Project, while maintaining a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or higher. Graduate course credit will be awarded only for earned grades of C or better. An electronic portfolio of course materials is also required at the completion of the M.Ed. program.
