Through the generosity of Susan Breakefield Fulton '61, the Chaplain position at Wilson College, currently held by Rev. Derek Wadlington, was renamed the Nancy A. Besch '48 and Elisabeth Clarkson '47 Chaplain of Wilson College and Director of the Curran Bonner Leader Program. All three of these amazing Wilson women played significant roles in keeping the College open in 1979 and provided steadfast leadership in the years that followed.

As part of the weekend, a service, led by Wilson Chaplain Rev. Derek Wadlington, was held at the historic Rocky Spring Church followed by brunch in Jensen Dining Hall. Remarks were shared from Susan, President Fugate, AAWC President Lynne DiStasio '74 and President Emerita, Mary-Linda Sorber Merriam Armacost, Honorary '91.

Excitement builds to finally gather on campus and celebrate with friends. Having three cycles of reunion years presents opportunities to celebrate with sister classes, as well as challenges given space and resources. This year will look different, but all efforts will be made to work in conjunction with class officers and keep communication flowing in the decision/planning process. Most activities will be scheduled Friday through Sunday with a few events offered earlier. The schedule will need to be finalized in the fall to go to the printer and the brochure mailed no later than early February. There will be an incentive for early registration, before April 1, 2022.

The staff are available for assistance with class lists, mailings, sample letters etc. Class gift inquiries or assistance should be made to Denise McDowell, Director of Development. All general reunion inquiries should be directed to Marybeth Famulare, Director Alumni Relations. Class dues for most classes are payable to AAWC and class gifts are payable to Wilson College (a few classes hold private accounts with different arrangements).

- 50<sup>th</sup> classes 1970, 1971 and 1972 will hold a large celebration in Laird. Pipe and drape will be added to make the space festive. There will ongoing discussion with class committees regarding menu, music, decorations, and program. 1970 and 1971 have completed their 50<sup>th</sup> yearbooks. Members of 1972 should watch for details coming soon.
- Due to space limitations this year, classes will need to share dinner and lounge areas.
- An updated local lodging list is on the reunion webpage. We encourage class representatives to consider a block of rooms and ask about lounge space. Campus residence hall lodging will also be available.
- Suggestions for sessions, speakers or activities are encouraged to be submitted soon.
- Options for class photography are still being discussed. Given technology, more photos are added online to download and less are purchased. - The office keeps a running list of those that may need travel assistance or those willing to provide transportation. While we cannot guarantee a ride, all efforts will be made to assist. Please be patient as details frequently depend on incoming registrations.
