He began working as a teaching artist when he was hired by New York City Ballet's education department where he worked for 11 years in their Nutcracker, Ballet Bridges, and Project Ballet Programs. During that time, he also co-founded and directed Garden State Dance Project, a hip-hop dance education company.

In 2015, Kababa joined the staff of The 92nd Street Y in New York (92NY), where he also worked as a facilitator for their Dance Education Laboratory. He is best known for his work with 92NY's School Engagement in the Arts that provides arts education programs for K-12 students and teachers. There, Kababa authored the "Hip-Hop to the Top" curriculum, serving over 1,000 students in New York City public schools annually pre-pandemic.

Graduates wear colored cords, lapel pins, and stoles to demonstrate membership in various honor societies and prestigious organizations as well as academic and athletic accomplishments. Individuals wearing silver cords are receiving degree honors (Summa Cum Laude, Magna Cum Laude, Cum Laude, or Distinction). Black and gold cords signify membership in Chi Alpha Sigma. Blue and white cords denote membership in Omicron Delta Kappa. Purple and white cords indicate membership in Sigma Theta Tau. Pink and blue cords show membership in Phi Beta Kappa. Members of Sigma Tau Delta and Pi Gamma Mu wear lapel pins unique to those honor societies. Student-athletes wear white stoles. Kente cloth stoles are worn to recognize the academic and cultural achievements of graduating Black and African-American students. Pride stoles are worn to recognize the academic accomplishments and identities of LGBTOA+ students and allies. Graduates wearing green ribbons have signed the Green Pledge and individuals carrying candles are members of the Candle Club.

HOODS

Hoods are the most distinctive feature of the American Inter-Collegiate Code. They vary in length according to the type of degree held and are lined with the official colors of the institution conferring the degree. The linings of Wilson College hoods are blue and silver. The distinctive colors on the two-inch velvet trim for bachelor's degrees, and three-inch velvet trim for master's degrees indicate the academic field.

MACE

An academic custom that originated in the 16th century is part of today's commencement ceremony. Although not as ornate as the first royal mace presented by Queen Elizabeth I of England to Oxford University in 1589, Wilson's cast-silver mace bears the official seal of the College.
