TORI MURDEN MCCLURE

NOTED EXPLORER AND FORMER PRESIDENT OF SPALDING UNIVERSITY

Tori Murden McClure retired from Spalding University in 2024, having worked there for 25 years and serving the last 14 years as president.

She is perhaps best-known as the first woman and first American to row a boat solo across the Atlantic Ocean, accomplishing this journey in 1999 after 81 days at sea in her boat “American Pearl.” Her memoir, “A Pearl in the Storm: How I Found My Heart in the Middle of the Ocean,” detailing her journey across the Atlantic, was the basis of the musical “Row.” A decade earlier, she was also one of the first women and first Americans to ski cross country to the South Pole.

As an accomplished mountaineer, McClure served as a former Board Chair of the National Outdoor Leadership School. She also worked as an Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) and Wilderness EMT for almost twenty-five years, while also providing EMT instruction to firefighters.

While attending Smith College, she was a dual-sport Division III student-athlete in basketball (team co-captain) and varsity crew and served as a student athletic trainer. She joined the Smith College Athletics Hall of Fame in 2012 and the Kentucky Sports Hall of Fame in 2000. She served a term as Vice Chair of the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Board of Governors, chaired the NCAA Division III Presidents Council, and was Acting Chair of the NCAA Board in 2020.

During her extensive career, she worked as a chaplain at Boston City Hospital, director of a Louisville, Kentucky women’s shelter, policy assistant to the Mayor of Louisville, and the first full-time employee of the Muhammad Ali Center. McClure holds a bachelor’s degree in psychology from Smith College, a Master of Divinity from Harvard Divinity School, a Juris Doctorate from the University of Louisville Brandeis School of Law, and a Master of Fine Arts in Writing from Spalding University.



KEVIN C. WELLS

Graduate Degree Program Student Speaker

Kevin C. Wells is earning his Master of Organizational Leadership degree from Wilson College to further his work in residential education, youth development, and systems of care.

Wells spent the first part of his career in Mississippi where he was a co-creator of the Interdependent Living Curriculum for the Mississippi Department of Child Protection Services. This trauma-informed program equipped foster youth ages 16 and older with essential skills in financial literacy, employment readiness, housing stability, wellness, and relational support — fostering autonomy while promoting healthy interdependence.

Wells's commitment to helping young people build sustainable, self-directed futures led him to the Milton Hershey School in Hershey, Pennsylvania. Since 2006, he has worked to support the School's residential programs, which includes working as a Transitional Living Coordinator for the last 16 years. For Wells, it was a privilege to join and serve within a mission-driven community like Milton Hershey School—an institution unmatched in its holistic, life-changing approach to education and care.

A classically trained pianist, Wells started playing piano at age three and received a music scholarship from the University of Mississippi, where he earned a Bachelor of Social Work. He has performed piano on hundreds of stages, including accompanying the internationally recognized Concert Singers and a featured appearance at Carnegie Hall in New York City.



ERIN REBECCA ROSZKOWIAK

Class of 2025 President, Undergraduate Degree Program Student Speaker

Erin Roszkowiak is a veterinary nursing major with minors in biology and chemistry. She earned a position on the Dean's List each semester of her undergraduate studies and will be the first Wilson student to receive honors in the veterinary nursing discipline. Roszkowiak completed a rotating veterinary nursing specialty internship at BluePearl Pet Hospital in Levittown, Pa. She is a native of Cinnaminson, N.J., and is the daughter of Terry and Michael Roszkowiak. She also has an older brother, Nick, and a Wilson whippet named Galloway.

Her leadership experience at Wilson includes serving as the academic captain of the Women's Soccer team, vice president of the Wilson chapter of Omicron Delta Kappa—the leadership honor society, and senior class president. She also completed the College's Phoenix Leaders program and worked for three years as a kennel supervisor.

Roszkowiak's dedication to her field of study includes serving as president of the pre-veterinary club and campus student ambassador for Rarebreed Veterinary Partners. She is also the first student to pursue Veterinary Nursing Honors Research. In 2023, she received a Wilson Academic Student Research Award to fund her senior thesis research on the effectiveness of anxiolytic supplemental use in cat colonies, and as a 2024 recipient of The Joan M. Thuebel '52 Earthwatch Award, she participated in a study of forest owls in Utah. She will pursue her long-term goal to become a veterinarian when she continues her studies at the University of Pennsylvania in Fall 2025.

HOODS

Hoods are the most distinctive feature of the American Inter-Collegiate Code. They vary in length according to the type of degree held and are lined with the official colors of the institution conferring the degree. The linings of Wilson College hoods are blue and silver. The colors on the two-inch velvet trim for bachelor's degrees, and three-inch velvet trim for master's degrees indicate the academic field of study.

MACE

An academic custom that originated in the 16th century is part of today's commencement ceremony. Although not as ornate as the first royal mace presented by Queen Elizabeth I of England to Oxford University in 1589, Wilson's cast-silver mace bears the official seal of the College.
