## FA 116, Painting I Exhibition

Visitors will see copies of Paul Cezanne's 1900, *Still Life*, a masterpiece painting in the collection of the National Gallery of Art in Washington, DC. Cezanne was often referred to as the Grandfather of Modernism, and is recognized for pushing color and form in new directions in late 19<sup>th</sup> century France. The paintings on display in the studio were made during a two week period, and focus on the long practiced technique of masterpiece copying, employed as a teaching methodology dating back to the Renaissance and beyond. Students explored light, color, form, expression, and attention to detail. You will be impressed! Also, see 3 ½ hour *alla prima* (Italian: on first attempt) paintings on studio easels.

# The Groovy Seventies – A Tribute to Harriet Bassler Argentiere '71 The Hankey Center

Harriet graduated from Wilson in 1971 with a degree in Fine Arts, and yet she spent her entire career in banking as a Vice President of several institutions in Annapolis, MD. She served on the board of the Society for the Prevention of Cruelty of Animals for 17 years. She and her husband, Pat, were Rolling Stones fanatics. They first saw the Stones perform in 1967 and went to countless concerts through the years. Harriet passed away in June 2016. This exhibit includes some of her work as a student at Wilson and demonstrates her skill at print-making, oils, and sketching. It also reveals her confident, joyful use of color that was a trademark of the groovy seventies.
