These funds are a result of the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES) that was signed into federal law on March 27, 2020. This grant award is not considered taxable income for you. Because you were enrolled as a full-time student at the time of the pandemic, you qualify for these dollars.

Please know the College was very thoughtful about the distribution of these funds.
