1. Enrollment: 397 Traditional 282 ADP <u>234</u> Graduate 923 Total

2. Giving: Total giving for FY15 (\$9,324,457) was the largest total raised in the past eight years. The Wilson Fund raised \$1.1 million from 1491 donors.

Library – as of October 15th Cash and pledges total \$12,225,431 from over 750 donors

The rededication and ribbon cutting was held on October 23rd. Guests were then given a tour of the library. The Library looks fantastic and has been designed to meet the needs of the different segments of the student population. It will be the heart of the campus.

- 3. The Board approved a name change for the Women with Children Program, to the Wilson College Single Parent Scholar Program. Under Title IX of the Education Amendments Act of 1972 is a federal law that states that no person in the US shall, on the basis of sex, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any education program or activity receiving Federal financial assistance. As Wilson College is now co-educational, we must offer equal programs to women and to men, and the Women with Children Program is not an exception to this law.
- 4. The endowment stands at approximately \$56 million. There is a concerted effort now to identify and prioritize the deferred maintenance issues and begin to address those parts of the physical plant that have waited too long for a refresh/update/repair.

5. Tuition and fees: The Board approved the following pricing structure -

- 8. Come to see the sculpture that now sits outside the Library. Artist Patrick Dougherty and his "helpers" did a wonderful job. Over the years, his work evolved from single pieces on conventional pedestals to monumental scale environmental works, which require saplings by the truckloads. He has built over 250 of these works, and become internationally acclaimed. People from the community come to campus every day to see this artistry.
